Students must satisfy all requirements as outlined below and by the department offering the minor.

Program Requirements

- Students must complete a minimum of 15 PSYC credit hours.
- Students must complete a minimum of 6 upper-division (3000-level and above) PSYC credit hours.
- Students must earn a minimum grade of C- (1.7) in all minor courses taken at CU Denver and must achieve a minimum cumulative minor GPA of 2.0. All graded attempts in required and elective courses are calculated in the minor GPA. Students cannot complete minor course requirements as pass/fail.
- Students must complete a minimum of 9 PSYC credit hours with CU Denver faculty, at least 6 of which must be upper division (3000-level and above).

Program Restrictions, Recommendations and Allowances

- Because minors are optional, there are no substitutions allowed to these requirements.
- Students cannot earn a Psychology minor if they are also seeking a Psychology degree.
